What Happens to the Case After All Requirements are Completed?

Participants who complete all requirements and graduate from the Veterans Program may earn a dismissal or a reduction in the term of supervised release.



Can a Person Be Discharged From the Veterans Program?

Yes. Those who do not comply with court orders and program requirements may be removed from participation in the Veterans Program.

Veterans Program Eligibility and Participation

Anyone who has served in the Military and has been charged with certain violations filed in a United States District Court is eligible.

Veterans Program is a Team

The Team consists of the Judge, Court Staff, U.S. Attorney's Office, Federal Public Defender, Criminal Justice Act Attorneys, U.S. Pretrial and Probation Officers, Veterans Justice Outreach Coordinator, and Veteran Mentors.



Program Outline

- Staffing: Prior to every
 Veterans Program hearing, the
 Team reviews progress and
 compliance of all participants.
- Requirements: Program
 participants attend court
 hearings held monthly to
 discuss with the Judge and
 other Team members their
 progress, concerns, or
 questions to assist in their
 successful completion of the
 Program.
- Successful completion results in advantages to the veteran regarding the charges.
- Defense attorneys are sometimes available to provide legal recommendations.
